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St Fagans: National History Museum





- Open air museum since 1948
- Specialising in reconstructed buildings
- Originally intended for preservation of Welsh rural life
- Later, industrial era buildings and material culture
- One of seven National Museum Wales sites
- Most popular tourist attraction in Wales (600,000 visitors)

Contemporary Collecting



"Contemporary collecting is one of the most difficult of practices because of its overwhelming and multifaceted nature, and because we are collecting things that reflect our own society, which we know to be complex. Collecting historical material only seems easier because there is less of it, we know it less well, and because historians have constructed narratives which value one thing above another"

Definition



- Existing, occurring, or living at the same time; belonging to the same time; of the present time; modern
- Post World War II, post Cold War, the Information Age, and a time of terrorism
- Popular culture, mass-production and disposability - "non-authentic spurious"
- Filling gaps in the collection

Collecting Policy



"Despite the spread of the use of collecting policies, collecting remains a largely untheorized and ill-considered area of museum work"
